

# SUPPLY LIST

Lucy Boston Workshop – April 10, 2021

This method of quilting makes for a very portable project which you can take to Doctor appointments, meetings, TV watching, etc. It makes a beautiful quilt, wall hanging, or pillow, and is fun to do.

## **Basic Sewing Supplies**

Sharp scissors, straight pins, small ruler, seam ripper, small wonder or binder clips, water erasable marker, glue stick (if desired), basting thread (can use up old thread), needles (I prefer #7 embroidery for basting and #8 embroidery for sewing honeycombs together, but milliners needles can also be used), good thread in neutral color for joining the honeycombs together (or can use matching thread to fabric.)

## **PATCHWORK / CROSSES**

To make life very easy and my recommendation, there are 2 places where you can get a **Basic Kit** for around \$40. The **Basic Kit** includes: 2 Lucy Boston Quilt Blocks, 1" acrylic honeycomb template, a pack (100) pieces 1" honeycombs, and a Sewline fabric glue stick. The **Basic Kit** can be ordered in one of 2 places:

You can call them and they will send the kit to you or you can visit their shop to get your **Basic Kit**. Please do not worry about the colors in the already made-up kits. All the patchworks look fabulous on a cream-colored or another neutral background. Again, this is the easiest way to go. If you want to finish the quilt in the **Athena method**, one of the ways Anne will show is how to finish the quilt. Order the pattern from the Quilt Merchant – the cost is \$9.00. **Kits should be ordered by MARCH 26** so that they arrive in time for the workshop.

If you already have some of the supplies and **don't** want a **Basic Kit**, you will need 3 or 4 different fabrics (at least 2 floral or a border prints – something with a repeat that will allow for multiple fussy cutting and a neutral background),

honeycomb paper pieces (need 24 for each patchwork/cross), and a 1" acrylic honeycomb template. Note picture on website.

## **FABRIC**

**I will show 4 different ways of finishing this project.** To be safe, get your background (cream color around the patchwork crosses on mine) fabric in a neutral color so as not to take away from the patchwork crosses.

**Pillow:** If you do not get a Basic Kit, see above fabric needs

For the wall hanging and quilt, if you do not get the Basic Kit, fabric needs for each patchwork cross is above. In addition you will need background fabric as follows:

**Wall hanging:** 2 – 2½ yards background

**Quilt:** 3½ - 4 yards background, depending how large you want to make it

You may need small amounts of other fabric, but for the moment, just go with the patchwork crosses and background material. When fabric buying, I always get a little more than is required so that I don't run out at the end of my project – I've been through that drill before trying to track down additional yardage. If you end up with extra background fabric, you can always use it as backing.

I think we should finish two patchwork crosses in the workshop.
